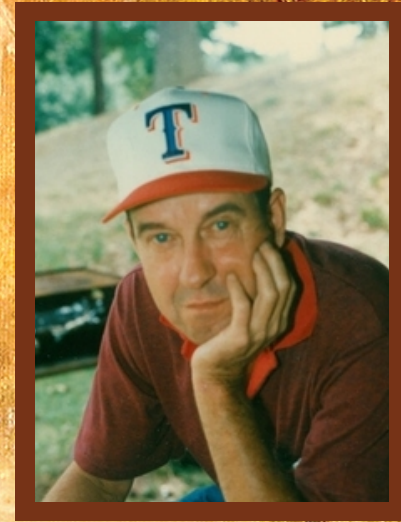
He was preceded in death by his mother, Mabel Williams; his father, Cincil Williams of West Virginia; and Buzz Williams, his best 4-legged friend in life.
